Schedule of Events

- Latest draft of the Climate Action Plan posted to City website on Friday, December 1
- Staff sends report on comments made by Task Force on CAP measures that the City did not include in the draft (sent on Monday, December 4)
- Staff and City Attorney work on preparing CEQA documentation for CAP (Notice of Intent, Initial Study and Negative Declaration)
- Climate Action Task Force meets on December 8 to discuss CAP, next steps, and possible recommendation for City Council Adoption
- If Task Force recommends the CAP for adoption by City Council on this date (December 8), CEQA documents and CAP are made available for public comment until January 30th. Once public comment period ends, Staff will present CAP to City Council.
- The term of the Task Force extends to one year from the date of establishment (January 17, 2017 as per City Council Resolution No. 4-17), or the receipt of a Draft CAP by the City Council, whichever is earlier.
- Once CAP 2.0 is adopted by City Council, we move on to the implementation phase.
